About the Institute

The Queen's University Political Studies Summer Institute is a two week residential program located at the beautiful Queen's University campus in Canada. It is the first ever political studies summer institute offered in Canada! Through hands-on learning, students will explore Canadian society, culture, and politics. The program combines both classroom programming and educational field trips to allow students to experience Canadian life. Additionally, students will visit some of Canada's monumental landmarks. The program includes a trip to Ottawa, the nation's capital; Ontario's capital Toronto; historic Montreal, and the world famous Niagara Falls.







Program Costs

The program fee for the Queen's University Political Studies Summer Institute is \$3,500 (CDN) for Chinese Students and \$5,500 (CDN) for Australian students. This covers the following:

Educational Field Trips



Upon arrival, students will visit the beautiful Niagara Falls. Students will explore the Niagara parkway and the downtown shopping scene. Additionally, students will have a tour of the Maid of the Mist.



During the first week of the program, students will travel to Ottawa, the nation's capital. While there, students will tour the <u>Canadian Parliament</u> buildings and learn about its importance for Canadian politics. Other activities in Ottawa include visiting two of Ottawa's most popular attractions, the <u>Canadian Museum of History</u> and Canadian War Museum.



Students will explore Montreal, Quebec in there second week of study. Montreal offers a great insight into the French culture that is integral to Canadian political culture. Students will explore the Bonsecours Market and Old Montreal. Additionally, students will visit St. Joseph's Oratory(Canada's largest church) and the Montreal Botanical Gardens.



During the second week, students will experience two days in Toronto, Ontario's capital. While there, students tour the <u>Canadian Broadcasting</u> <u>Company</u> and the <u>CN Tower</u>. Students will also have a full day of free time to explore the cities shopping and eating districts.
